<u>ENGLISH</u> <i>Reading</i>	Please read every day for half an hour. Create a list of your top 10 books to read before leaving primary school. These can be a mixture of text types and can be for any age. You could even present them using a voiceover and images just like the top 10 on the charts.
<i>Literacy</i>	<i>I will continue reading 'Can you See Me' this week. Keep up with the story – I know lots of you are really enjoying it. There are a few chapters left so I will read a couple every day.</i> <u>Monday</u> Complete the spelling crossword linked to the Year 5/6 spelling list and the SPaG mat to remind you of your grammar terminology. Choose 10 spellings from the Year 5/6 list and create a wordsearch using these words. Take a photograph and upload it to Seesaw for others to try.
	<u>Tuesday</u> Read the poem 'Our Tiny Feet' and highlight and annotate any features which make this an effective piece of poetry using the attached toolkit. This week, you will be writing your own poem to summarise your time at St. Michael's.
	<u>Wednesday</u> Plan your own poem linked to your school life. This is your chance to really express yourself through poetry. Can you add in some different emotions? Be creative. I can't wait to read these.
	<u>Thursday</u> Write your own piece of poetry and edit your work – checking your spellings and punctuation and ensuring you have used high level vocabulary.
	<u>Friday</u> Write up and illustrate your poem. Share it on Seesaw.
