P4C

This half term we will be taking part in Philosophy for Children. P4C is a programme that allows children to develop their thinking skills in a caring, critical, creative and collaborative way. P4C can improve the children's thinking and listening skills as well as giving them the tools to be able to disagree with another person in a reasonable way.

PE

In PE this half term, our topics are Invasion Games and Sending and Receiving. We will develop ball skills individually and then apply them to team game situations. We will explore the roles of attackers and defenders and how to carry these out successfully to score goals or points. We will develop accuracy and control when throwing, catching, and dribbling a ball.

DESIGN AND TECHNOLOGY

Moving Minibeasts

We will research different mechanisms and learn how to create them with paper. Then, we will design and make a moving picture featuring minibeasts to be included in a storybook. Finally, we will evaluate our work to identify successes and improvements.

KNITTED KNOWLEDGE

- ➤ I know that a sliding mechanism allows an object or picture to move in a straight line.
- I know that the pivot allows the lever to move from side to side in an arc.
- ➤ I know that a wheel mechanism has a pivot which allows a larger, outside wheel to move around an inside, smaller wheel.
