MATHS

In Maths, we will find equivalences between fractions, decimals and percentages and will learn how to find percentages of numbers. We will use our fluency skills to develop our arithmetic further and work on solving and proving reasoning questions.

We will then move on to calculating area, perimeter and volume.

As part of our Maths work this half term, we will also create line graphs and interpret information from a range of graphs including pie charts.

ENGLISH

In English, we will continue reading 'Letters from a Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. We will be studying this in detail looking specifically at our VIPERS skills of vocabulary, inference, prediction, explanation, retrieval and summarizing the text.

We will study a range of flashback stories and will write our own story based on the film clip – The Piano. We will focus on high-level language and the use of more complex punctuation to make our writing precise and mature. Grammar and punctuation will also remain a priority in everything that we do.

We will be able to suggest strategies someone could use to avoid being pressured.

We can use different strategies to manage stress and pressure.

Knitted Knowledge:

We know how to move our bodies to the beat. We know some notes on the recorder.

Super Skills:

We will compare two songs in the same style, talking about what stands out musically in each of them, their similarities and differences.

We will sing in unison.

RELIGION & WORLDVIEWS – Who is

Jesus?

Knitted Knowledge:

We will know that prophets told people what would happen in the future.

We will know that followers of Jesus in the past and present time believe the miracles shows Jesus was God's son.

Super Skills:

We will understand that Jesus' actions sometimes made him unpopular.

We will be able to present our own and other's ideas in response to big questions about meaning and truth.

FRENCH

Knitted Knowledge:

I know some feminine nouns which name places in a town.

I know how to say quarter to the hour.

I know the time in Moscow is two hours ahead of Paris. Super Skills:

I can make an adjective agree with a feminine noun. I can make some compound sentences about towns.

PE – Yoga

Knitted Knowledge:

We will know a range of yoga poses and how they can help develop our core strength and balance.

Super Skills:

We will hold our poses for a set period of time and create controlled positions.

We will stretch our bodies in a variety of ways and link our yoga moves into a routine.

SCIENCE – What is evolution?

Knitted Knowledge:

We will know that life cycles have evolved to help organisms survive to adulthood.

We will know that organisms best suited to their

environment are more likely to survive long enough to reproduce.

We will know that organisms that are best adapted to reproduce are more likely to do so.

Super Skills:

We will be able to plan, carry out and analyse an investigation.

We will be able to identify how plants and animals change over time to suit their surroundings.

ART – Artist study – Paul Nash

Knitted Knowledge:

We will know all about the work of Paul Nash and how his artwork developed throughout World War 1. <u>Super Skills:</u>

We will use pencil to sketch artefacts from the war – focussing on shape and form.

We will use charcoal to layer our work and build up a setting from a war scene.

We will evaluate use oil pastels to contrast from charcoal and add specific detail to our work.

HISTORY – What was life like as a child during WW2?

Knitted Knowledge:

We will know when World War II started and ended and know some of the main events.

Super Skills:

We will be able to ask relevant questions to enhance our knowledge and carry out some of my own research. We will be able to use a range of sources to find out about World War II.
